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2011 Pension Plan Increases and Thank You

2011 Pension Plan Increases

The Internal Revenue Service and the Social Security Administration have recently announced the 2011 Pension Plan cost-of-living increases. For your convenience and reference, they are listed below, along with the 2010 limits, which are shown for comparison purposes. For the second year in a row, the amounts shown in both columns are the same, i.e., there is no cost-of-living increase for 2011 for these items.

Item	2011	2010
1. Maximum contribution to a 401(k) Plan	\$ 16,500	\$ 16,500
2. Additional 401(k) Plan Catch-Up Contribution (for participants age 50 and over)	5,500	5,500
3. Maximum Profit Sharing Plan contribution for a participant*	49,000	49,000
4. Maximum 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan contribution for a participant age 50 or older*	54,500	54,500
5. Maximum Defined Benefit Pension Plan Benefit (Dollar Limit payable at ages 62 to 65)	195,000	195,000
6. Maximum compensation that can be used for Plan purposes	245,000	245,000
7. Highly Compensated Employee Compensation Threshold	110,000	110,000
8. Social Security Taxable Wage Base	106,800	106,800

* Please note that the defined benefit contribution may be higher than the maximum profit sharing and 401(k) amounts shown above. Please contact us if you want to contribute more than these amounts.
